CONFERENCE OF STATE MINISTERS ON CO-OPERATION

*137. SHRI S. C. DEB: Will the Minister of COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND CO-OPERATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether a conference of State Ministers was held in the month of March, 1959, to discuss certain issues on Co-operation; and

(b) if so, what was the outcome of that conference?

THE PARLIAMENTARY SECRETARY TO THE MINISTER OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AND COOPERATION (SHRI S. D. MISRA): (a) No, Sir.

(b) Does not arise.

SHRI S. C. DEB: May I know, Sir, whether there was a proposal for holding a conference?

SHRI S. D. MISRA: Yes, Sir. There was a proposal but it was postponed due to the illness of the Minister of Community Development and Cooperation. Now it is going to be held at Mysore in July.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: May I know, Sir, in view of the conference, whether the Government has asked the State Governments to furnish their statistics about Co-operation there and their plans for setting up service and other co-operative organisations having regard to the little Resolution that they passed at Nag-pur?

SHRI S. D. MISRA: After the N. D. C. Resolution regarding Cooperation and after the report of the Working Group on Co-operation, the States were addressed to let us know the programme. Some of the States have indicated while others have yet not. All these matters will be taken up in the Co-operative Ministers' Conference to be held, as I stated.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: Is the hon. Minister aware that in many States these things are not taken very seriously and there is no inclination to radically alter the existing arrangement and formulate plans in consonance with the latest declarations of the Centre?

SHRI S. D. MISRA: That is not so as stated by the hon. Member.

SHRI S. C. DEB: May I know, Sir, what are the difficulties that the Government are facing and what would be their programme in the next conference?

SHRI S. D. MISRA: There are several difficulties in regard to cooperation. One is regarding the

change of laws. The other is about the exact pattern that we are likely to establish. The third is about cooperative farming. All these require detailed examination.

LOCATION OF SECOND SHIPYARD

SHRI P. A. SOLOMON:

Will the Minister of TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS be pleased to state:

(a) whether a decision on the location of the second shipyard has been taken; and

(b) if so, where it is to be located?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI RAJ BAHADUR):

(a) Not yet. The Inter-Departmental Committee appointed to examine the report of the U. K. Shipyard Mission is still engaged in examining certain technical points which have to be investigated before a site could be finally decided.

(b) Does not arise.

SHRI P. A. SOLOMON: May I know, Sir, what is the reason for the delay in taking a decision in the matter?

SHRI RAJ BAHADUR: This is a very serious matter—the determination of a site for the second shipyard. We have appointed a Commit-

tee with a very high level personnel, with Mr. N. R. Pillai, as the Chairman, and I think they should be allowed to have their time to consider and come to certain conclusions in regard to all the intricate points, technical and otherwise, in respect of the location of the second shipyard.

SHRI PERATH NARAYANAN NAIR: May I have an idea of the intricate points which are coming in the way of taking a decision in the matter?

SHRI RAJ BAHADUR: It would neither be fair, nor desirable, nor possible for me to disclose the various matters which the Committee have in mind.

DR. P. J. THOMAS: Is the hon. Minister aware that there is considerable anxiety in Kerala about this matter, because there is terrible unemployment in Kerala and the location of the shipyard in that part will increase their employment opportunities?

SHRI RAJ BAHADUR: We are very well aware of the anxiety of the people of Kerala and also of this House in regard to the need for an early decision in this matter. I think their anxiety too will be fully taken note of by this Committee.

DR. A. N. BOSE: What are the different suggestions about the location of the shipyard?

SHRI RAJ BAHADUR: So far as the Shipyard Mission is concerned, we know that they have made five alternative suggestions and the Committee is going into them but they have placed Cochin as the number one.

SHRI B. P. BASAPPA SHETTY: Is it a fact that Kandla was at one time proposed to be selected as it had all the facilities such as hinterland and big forests to supply the required timber?

SHRI RAJ BAHADUR: Not by the Shipyard Mission.
