

**DISPLACEMENT OF PEOPLE CAUSED BY  
CONSTRUCTION OF RAJASTHAN CANAL**

\*201. SHRI V. K. DHAGE: Will the Minister of IRRIGATION AND POWER be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that the Government of Punjab has conveyed to the Central Government its concern over the gigantic displacement of the people which will be caused by the construction of the Rajasthan Canal, a length of 110 miles of which is to run through the State of Punjab; and

(b) if so, what steps the Central Government are taking in this regard?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER OF IRRIGATION AND POWER (SHRI J. S. L. HATHI): (a) No specific reference to this effect has been received from the Government of Punjab. They had, however, suggested that the oustees from the areas to be acquired for this Project should receive priority in the matter of colonisation.

(b) It has been decided that colonisation policy on the Rajasthan Canal Project will be laid down by the Central Government in consultation with the Governments of Punjab and Rajasthan and will be implemented by the Rajasthan Canal Board, comprising representatives of the Government of India, Government of Punjab and Government of Rajasthan.
