SHRI V. PRASAD RAO: What specific action has been taken in that regard because the hon. Planning Minister has promised to do something about it?

Oral Answers

SHRI S. N. MISHRA: Our views in the matter of ceiling are well known to the House but we have also said that the State Governments urge the special conditions and circumstances prevailing in their States. The matter is still under discussion.

SHRI V. PRASAD RAO: Planning Minister aware that the Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh has given out the statement that if the Planning Commission insists in that particular matter, he is going to withdraw the Bill?

SHRI S N. MISHRA: That particular statement has not come to my notice.

SHRI V. PRASAD RAO: Is it the policy that whenever the Planning Commission intervenes on behalf of the peasants, the landlords who dominant there bring their pressure to withdraw the Bill?

Mr. CHAIRMAN: It is not the policy—no question of policy in these matters.

OFFICIAL LIQUIDATOR IN THE HIGH COURT OF MADRAS

*185. SHRI N. RAMAKRISHNA Will the Minister of Com-MERCE AND INDUSTRY be pleased to

- (a) whether the official liquidator in the High Court of Madras is a full time officer of the Company Law Administration; and
- (b) if the answer to part above be in the negative, whether the volume of liquidation work Madras warrants the appointment of a full time officer?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER OF COM-MERCE AND INDUSTRY (SHRI SATISH CHANDRA): (a) No. Sir.

(b) Not at present but Government will initiate necessary action as soon as the situation warrants it.

SHRI N. RAMAKRISHNA IYER: How does the volume of work Madras compare with the volume of work in Calcutta and Bombay?

SHRT SATISH CHANDRA: The. volume of work at Calcutta and Bombay is much greater than at Madras. Only 13 companies have gone into liquidation in Madras since the passing of the Companies' Act and there are 33 pending cases under the old Act of 1913.
