EXPIRY OF PERMITS AND VISAS OF PAKISTANIS LIVING IN SAURASHTRA

*380 SHRI DAHYABHAI V PATEL: Will the Minister of Home Affairs be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government are aware that there are about 1500 Pakistanis in Saurashtra whose permits and visas have expired, and they have failed to leave India; and
- (b) if so, what action Government are taking in the matter?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI B. N. DATAR): (a) and (b). The information is being collected and will be laid on the Table of the House, as soon as it is available.

SHRI DAHYABHAI V. PATEL: Does the Government contemplate putting any restriction on these people who are here without a regular permit?

SHRI B. N. DATAR: Sir, the matter is governed by the Passport Rules and the Foreigners Act has recently been passed by Parliament and necessary action is taken. As soon as it is found that a person has been remaining here without a permit, immediate action is taken.

SHRI V. K. DHAGE: What has the Government done so far if these people have remained here even after the expiration of their permits? Are there any such people there?

SHRI B. N. DATAR: Sir, this is the information that the hon. Member has given us. We are making enquiries. May I point out to the House that immediately this is detected, action will be taken?

SHRI V. K DHAGE: No, no. Sir, the point is whether there are any people who are overstaying their period in Saurashtra?

SHRI B. N. DATAR: That is the point for enquiry.

SHRI V. K. DHAGE: Has not the Government Department received any complaint?

SHRI B. N. DATAR: We have not received any complaints that any such

persons are there. But inasmuch as the hon. Member has raised this question, we are making a full enquiry and a statement will be placed.

SHRI DAHYABHAI V. PATEL: Is the hon. Minister aware that the Gujarati press is full of reports of these large number of people in Saurashira whose terms have expired?

SHRI B. N. DATAR: I am not aware of that, but I shall make enquiries.

SHRI H. V. TRIPATHI: May I know whether there is any machinery by which the Government may know as to which foreigner has gone back and when?

SHRI B. N. DATAR: The Government has a machinery in the respect.

CENTRAL GRANT FOR CIVIC AMENITIES IN DELHI

*381. SHRI M. VALIULLA: Will the Minister of Home Affairs be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Central Government have been approached by the Delhi Municipal Corporation for a special grant to provide civic amenities to the citizens; and
- (b) if so, what is Government's reaction to that request?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI B. N. DATAR): (a) and (b). The Government of India have appointed a special officer to examine the financial resources of the Corporation so as to determine the grants to be made by the Central Government. The officer is expected to submit his report by the 31st March, 1959. In the meantime, the following grants have been made or are proposed to be made to the Corporation for the current financial year:—

(a) A grant of Rs. 70 lakhs with a view to enabling the Corporation to meet the expendi-
