Shri M. H. SAMUEL: Is the Provident Fund deduction same as in civilian employment in respect of other ranks? In view of the short-service of the other ranks, I thought you should pay some special consideration for higher Provident Fund deductions.

SARDAR S. S. MAJITHIA: I am afraid I have not said that point. But it compares better with the civilian...

Mr. CHAIRMAN: Mr. Vallabha Rao.

TEACHERS IN BASIC SCHOOLS IN DELHI

\*78. Shri J. V. K. VALLABHA-RAO: Will the Minister of Education be pleased to state the present number of teachers in Basic Schools in Delhi who are not confirmed?

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION (Dr. K. L. Shrimali): 690.

Shri J. V. K. VALLABHARAO: May I know why they are not confirmed?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: This process of confirmation is a continuous one and is in charge of the Corporation and it is engaging the attention of the Corporation.

SHRI J. V. K. VALLABHARAO: How long are they kept as unconfirmed teachers?

Dr. K. L. SHRIMALI: Well, Sir, the teachers in the senior Basic Schools who were appointed before 1-8-1955 have all been confirmed. The junior Basic School teachers appointed before 1st September, 1951, have been confirmed. They get their cases reviewed periodically and I expect the Corporation to take the necessary steps.

## STATEMENT

The Organisation consists of two parts, (i) the Executive Council, and (ii) the functional field centres. At its meeting held on the 15th October 1958, the Governing Body of the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research, has constituted the Executive Council. The Executive Council

will take steps to bring the functional centres into being as soon as possible.

- 7. Representative of the Central Drug Research Institute, Lucknow—Member.
- 8. Representative of the National Botanical Gardens, Lucknow Member.
- 9 & 10. Two representatives from States—Members.
- 11. Financial Adviser to the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research, New Delhi—Member.

The members of the Executive Council have been appointed to represent the various interests concerned. Col. Chopra has been appointed in view of the fact that he has specialised in the study and development of medicinal plants.

THE DEPUTY MINISTER OF FINANCE (SHRI B. R. BHAGAT): (a) It is a fact that some gold smuggled from Pakistan to India across the Rajasthan border passes through Jodhpur.
