† THE MINISTER OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT (SHRI S. K. DEY): (a) Preliminary examination has been completed.

(b) Recommendations relating to "Democratic Decentralisation" and the abolition of the distinction between N.E.S., intensive and post-intensive stages and the staggering of the programme are being processed with the State Governments. Other recommendations are being studied by the Central and State Governments with view to taking further necessary action.1

राम सहाय : क्या माननीय मंत्री महोदय यह बताने की कृपा करेंगे कि राष्ट्रीय विस्तार सेवा खंड के कार्यों में जनता का पर्याप्त सहयोग मिलता है या नहीं ?

SHRI S. K. DEY: Sir, efforts are being made to secure the maximum amount of co-operation from the public. Of course, the Government is never satisfied with what is being achieved, and the Government always engaged in trying to improve on present co-operation.

श्री राम सहाय : क्या माननीय मंत्री महोदय को यह जानकारी है कि वहां के जो जनता के प्रतिनिधि हैं उनसे ग्रधिकारी-गण पूरा सहयोग नहीं प्राप्त करते हैं ?

SHRI S. K. DEY: It varies from State to State and from area to area. know of areas where there is complete co-operation between non-officials and officials. I also know of areas where there is complete lack of co-operation. So we are continuously trying improve the conditions.

SHRI V. VENKATARAMANA: Will this House get the opportunity to discuss this Committee's report before any action is taken by the Government, and if so, when?

SHRI S. K. DEY: Sir, that is question which I cannot decide.

SHRI V. VENKATARAMANA: If we are not going to discuss that report here, how can the views of this House be known and how can there be representation for this House?

SHRI S. K. DEY: We are trying to consult the Members of the Informal Consultative Committee who, I believe, can represent the views of this House.

SHRI V. VENKATARAMANA: I to understand that once for all you have decided that this report will not be discussed in the House?

SHRI S. K. DEY: Sir, if it is decided by you to have it discussed in the House, we can have no objection.

Mr. Venkatara-Mr. CHAIRMAN: mana, if you want it to be discussed, give notice of a motion and then we will decide it.

SHRI N. R. MALKANI: May I know, Sir, how many States have examined these recommendations and given their opinions to the Government of India?

SHRI S. K. DEY: Sir, the recommendations are being examined in all the States. In fact, before the recommendations were formulated by Study Team, all the States were consulted. Now the final recommendations have been sent to State the Governments, and they studied and discussed.

SHRI N. R. MALKANI: Is it a fact. Sir, that some of the States have-

already accepted the recommendations and implemented them?

SHRI S. K. DEY: In fact, implementation was proceeding even before the report came into being.

SHRI N. R. MALKANI: Has the Government of India given any directions about it?

SHRI S. K. DEY: Over certain basic issues, for instance, democratic decentralisation. This matter was considered in the National Development Council recently, and a decision was taken that there should be decentralisation. The State Governments are now trying to develop the forms in which this recommendation has to be given effect to.

SHRI DEOKINANDAN NARAYAN: May I know, Sir, whether one of the recommendations is that these community areas should be entrusted to gram panchayats, and if this question is referred to the State Governments, which State Governments have accepted this recommendation?

Shri S. K. DEY: Sir, this question has been accepted in principle by all the States, but the forms in which this recommendation is to be implemented are still being studied by the State Governments.

SHRI MAHESWAR NAIK: Just now, Sir the hon. Minister stated that the Government is not satisfied with the public co-operation. May I know, Sir, what are the particular aspects of co-operation with which the Government is not satisfied, and in what way does the Government intend to have co-operation from the public?

SHRI S. K. DEY: Sir, it is a different question. But even then I can say that it is not the quality of public co-operation, but the volume of public co-operation, and the effort of the Government always is that the maximum co-operation that the public can offer should be ensured and there should be the maximum co-ordination between officials and non-officials.

SHRI V. VENKATARAMANA: Sir, in view of the answer of the Minister that the States have already started implementation of some of the recommendations, do I understand that there is no co-ordinated and comprehensive policy of the Government of India as far as the State Governments are concerned?

SHRI S. K. DEY: Sir, conditions vary so widely from State to State in this vast sub-continent that there cannot be one uniform pattern applicable to the whole of India.
