DR. RAGHUBIR SINH: May I know, Sir, if Government's attention was not drawn last year when the Kjtch Government was the responsibility of the Central Government about an institution for training in sanitary things?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: Sir, the hon. Member is now jumping from New Delhi to Kutch, I don't know.

MR. DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: This question is about bogus institutions in New Delhi.

DR. RAGHUBIR SINH: Yes, Sir. But I think the Central Government's attention was drawn to it by the students coming from Kutch when the Kutch Government was the charge of the Central Government.

MR. DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: We are concerned only with New Delhi.

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: I have already informed the hon. Member.

MR. DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: It ic out of order

DR. RAGHUBIR SINH: Sir, I am referring only to institutions in New Delhi. The students came from Kutch, for the Kutch Government had sent them to New Delhi.

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: There was no bogus institution in New Delhi.

SHRI V. K. DHAGE: Sir, the question put by Dr. Raghubir Sini is whether the attention of Government was drawn by students coming from Kutch, to the effect that there were bogus institutions in Delhi?

MR. DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: Did the Kutch students make such a complaint?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: As far as New Delhi is concerned there are no bogus institutions. Government's attention was drawn to certain bogus institutions in Delhi

SHRI V. C. KESAVA RAO: May I know whether all the institutions in Delhi and New Delhi have been registered?

Dr. K. L. SHRIMALI: Some institutions are registered. I do not know if all are registered.

MR. DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: Any-way, there are no bogus institutions.

REMUNERATION OF FOREIGNERS EMPLOYED IN THE DEFENCE SERVICES

*593. SHRI KISHEN CHAND: Will the Minister of Defence be pleased to state:

- (a) what is the remuneration of the foreigners employed at present in the three wings of the Defence Services; and
 - (b) what is the nature of their duties?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER OF DEFENCE (SHRI K. RACHURAMAIAH): (a) The remuneration given to foreign Service personnel in the Army and the Air Force is the same as that given to the Indian personnel of equivalent ranks. In the Navy, the total emoluments of the British officers, who have been seconded from the Royal Navy Service, vary from Rs. 1,977 to Rs. 6,780 per month. The remuneration of foreigners serving 88 civilians in the Defence Services varies from Rs. 125 to Rs. 3,200 per month.

(b) The duties of the foreigners employed in the three wings of the Defence Services include executive, administrative, instructional, technical and general duties.

SHRI KISHEN CHAND: May I know whether these officers get any overseas allowance or any special allowance?

SHRI K. RAGHURAMAIAH: There are different categories of officers in this and their tota] number *is about* 26. I have not got the exact breakup of the amounts we pay. But the

emoluments I have stated are those which include everything.

SHRI KISHEN CHAND: What is the number of officers now in the Navy who are in actual command of ships?

SHRI K. KAGHURAMAIAH: The number of non-Indian officers in the Navy is five.

SHRI KISHEN CHAND: But my question is how many of them are in actual command of any ship, as say, the captain of the ship?

SHRI K. RAGHURAMAIAH: I would like to have notice, Sir.

SHRI TAJAMUL HUSAIN: What is the total number of foreigners employed in the Defence Services?

MR. DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: He gave it as twenty six.

SHRI TAJAMUL HUSAIN: What is the total amount of money spent per annum on their pay etc.?

MR. DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: Have you got the total amount of money?

SHRI K.' RAGHURAMAIAH: No, Sir, I have given the number of officers as 26.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: In addition to those belonging to the United Kingdom, who are the other foreigners who are in all the Services?

Mr. DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: We are only concerned with the Army, Navy and the Air Force.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: Yes, Sir. In those services in addition to those belonging to the U.K. what other foreigners are there?

MR. DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: Foreigners are foreigners.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: I mean, besides those from the U.K. how many Irishmen, Belgians, Frenchmen etc. are there? SHRI K. RAGHURAMAIAH: So far as the Navy is concerned, at most all of them are British. I have not got now the information as to the nationality of the other employees, if any.

SHRI MAHESWAR NAIK: What is the extra emolument which is being given to these foreigners over and above what is given to the Indian officers?

SHRI K. RAGHURAMAIAH: So far as the Army and the Air Force are concerned, I have stated that the pay is the same as what we give to the Indian officers. In the case of the Navy I have given the range of salaries to foreigners as Rs. 1,977 to Rs. 6,780. Among the Indian officers the highest emolument goes to the Rear Admiral who is an Indian and it is Rs. 2,250.

SHRI KISHEN CHAND: Are Government making efforts for replacing these officers progressively by Indians?

SHRI K. RAGHURAMAIAH: Very definite efforts are being made. I may say for the information of the House that in 1949 we had 89 British officers. Now, we have only five.

REDUCTION OF S. D. HIGH SCHOOL JANGPURA, NEW DELHI TO MIDDLE SCHOOL

- *594. SHRI M. VALIULLA: Will the Minister of EDUCATION AND SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that a Government aided S. D. High School in Jangpura, New Delhi, has been reduced to Middle School;
- (b) whether the inhabitants have protested against this action; and
- (c) what action Government have taken on the representation of the inhabitants of the locality?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION AND SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH (SHRI K. L. SHRIMALI): (a) No such orders have
