**APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING SCHEME IN VILLAGE DEVELOPMENT**

223. SHRI DEOKINANDAN NARAYAN: Will the Minister of COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) what are the main features of the apprenticeship training scheme in village development;

(b) what was the manner in which the apprentices were distributed to each State during the year 1956; and

(c) what is the extent of expenditure incurred by Government on each apprentice and on the entire scheme in 1956?

THE MINISTER OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT (SHRI S. K. DEY): (a) The scheme aims to develop a spirit of social service and understanding of the problems of rural reconstruction amongst selected university students and teachers. (Copy of the scheme has been placed in the Parliament Library).

(b) Apprentices were allotted according to the universities and not according to States. The distribution

was effected by the Ministry of Education and Scientific Research to various universities during 1956. A statement of distribution is laid on the Table of the House.

(c) The total amount spent by the Ministry of Community Development is approximately Rs. 1,26,500 and by the Ministry of Education Rs. 1,38,950. Rate of expenditure incurred on each apprentice is as follows:

\*D.A. Rs. 2-8-0 per diem up to six weeks.

†Stipend Rs. 25 per week up to six weeks.

Total Rs. 265 per apprentice.

(a) Yes. The course has been started at the Cellulose and Paper Branch of the Forest Research Institute, Dehra Dun, with effect from 5th August 1957.
