POWER SUPPLY TO WEST PAKISTAN FROM JOGENDRANAGAR POWER STATION

- *137. Dr. RAGHUBIR SINH: Will the Minister of Irrigation and Power be pleased to state:
- (a) the quantum of power being supplied at present to West Pakistan from the Jogendranagar Power Station;
- (b) whether any proposal has been received by Government for the discontinuance of this power supply in future: and
- (c) if so whether any plans have already been prepared for the utilisation of all this power that will thus be spare?

THE MINISTER OF IRRIGATION AND POWER (SHRI S. K. PATIL): (a) Power to the extent of 4,000 K.W. is being supplied to West Pakistan from the Uhl River Hydro Electric Scheme at present.

- (b) Not so far.
- (c) Does not arise.

SHRI MAHESWAR NAIK: With the canal water dispute unsettled, why is it that we are supplying Pakistan with water and even electricity?

SHRI S. K. PATIL: We do not believe in the tit-for-tat policy.

SHRI KISHEN CHAND: May know from the hon. Minister the cost that is charged for this power supply and also whether he has taken into account the increase in the cost production of electricity?

SHRI S. K. PATIL: I would require notice. Sir.

SHRI V. K. DHAGE: Have the Pakistan Government paid their dues so far in this behalf?

SHRI S. K. PATIL: So far as electricity is concerned, yes.
