THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI B. N. DATAR): (a) Yes.

(b) (i) The result of the 1957 examination has not yet been announ ced;

(ii) All persons appointed against permanent vacancies in Grade IV on the results of the two examinations held in 1955 are expected to be confirmed shortly, steps are being taken to complete the preliminaries in this connection.

SEIZURE OF CONTRABAND GOODS ON GOA BORDER

511. SHRI M. VALIULLA: Will the Minister of FINANCE be pleastd to state the value of contraband goods seized by the Customs authorities on the Goa border during the year 1956 and so far in the year 1957?

THE MINISTER OF FINANCE (SHRI T. T. KRISHNAMACHARI): The value of contraband goods seized by the Customs authorities on the Goa border during the year 1956 and up to 31st July 1957 is Rs. 3,65,724 and Rs. 2,56,780 respectively.

There is already a training college for Indian Police Service Officers at Mount Abu, and a Central Detective Training School, a Forensic Laboratory and a Central Finger Print Bureau hav« been set up at Calcutta.
