Category I—Cotton with mean staple Length exceeding 1-1/8"

Two or more prizes of the value of Rs. 5,000 each plus a gold medal of the value of Rs. 500 for each person.

Category II—Cottons with mean staple length between 28/32" and 1-1/8";

One award each of the value of Rs. 3,000 plus a gold medal of Rs. 300 for each person in each of the following classes:—

- (a) Asiatic cotton—irrigated;
- (b) Asiatic cotton—unirrigated;
- (c) American cotton—irrigated;
- (d) American cotton—unirrigated.

While evaluating the merits of a strain to qualify for the award, the primary emphasis will be on fibre quality of the strain but due weightage will also be given to other characters like yield, ginning percentage and resistance to pests and diseases.

The strains entering the competition will be judged by a Committee consisting of the following persons and the strain making the highest score will qualify for the prize:—

- 1. President, Indian Central Cotton Committee.
- 2. Vice-President, Indian Central Cotton Committee.
- 3. Agricultural Commissioner with the Government of India.
- 4. Director of Agriculture of the State concerned.
- One Senior cotton breeder (to be nominated in consultation with the Agricultural Commissioner with the Government of India).
- 6. Secretary, Indian Central Cotton Committee.

The above Committee will not only judge the merits of the different strains entering the competion, but will also decide the claims of the persons responsible for the production of the strains.
