DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: I do not have the figures just now. If the hon. Member gives me notice, I shall be able to answer it.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: May I know whether there are any German studying here under any othe scheme apart from this scheme?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: The hor Member wanted to know about thi scheme. If he wants to know about the other schemes, he should give m notice.

DR. P. C. MITRA: May I know how many Indian nationals are study ing in Germany under this scheme?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: Under thi particular scheme it was arrange< that the German Government wouli provide 50 places for Indian nation als in various German Universitie and technical institutions and 10i places for the training of Indiai engineers in German industries.

SHRI H. P. SAKSENA: May know whether the term 'German Fellows' has been used in the dignific or vulgar sense?

MR. CHAIRMAN: Very dignified.

DR. P. C. MITRA: May I know the total amount spent on the German Fellows who have so far finished their studies in India?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: The tota amount I do not have, but they gel a maintenance allowance of Rs. 50C per month and also passage.

TRAINING OF INDIAN ENGINEERS IN FOREIGN COUNTRIES IN THE MANUFACTURE OF IRON AND STEEL

*4. SHRI V. C. KESAVA RAO: Will the Minister for IRON AND STEEL be pleased to state:

(a) the number of engineers so far sent to the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, West Germany, the United Kingdom and other countries for

aining in the various branches of an and steel manufacture; and

(b) the period of their training?

THE MINISTER FOR IRON AND STEEL (SHRI T. T. KRISHNAMACHARI): The Ministry has so far sent 91 engineers to the U.S.S.R., 80 engineers to West Germany and none to other countries yet.

(b) 6 months to begin with but in be extended by mutual agreement.

SHRI V. C. KESAVA RAO: May I know how these engineers are being elected?

SHRI T. T. KRISHNAMACHARI: On the basis of their qualifications and on the basis of our needs.

DR. P. C. MITRA: May I know whether all the engineers are in Government service?

SHRI T. T. KRISHNAMACHARI: They will be in the service of the steel plants.

SHRI V. C. KESAVA RAO: May I know the terms and conditions on which these engineers are being given training in foreign countries?

SHRI T. T. KRISHNAMACHARI: Their salaries are fixed. The terms and conditions are that we send them over there and we meet all their expenses, and when they are out, they are paid their salaries in this country.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: Apart from these qualified engineers, may I know whether others also are sent?

SHRI T. T. KRISHNAMACHARI: We do not send unqualified people anywhere.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: Those people who are not degree-holders.

SHRI T. T. KRISHNAMACHARI: Maybe they are degree-holders or

diploma-holders, but the people must have some precise qualifications. Otherwise they are not chosen for such training.

DR. R. P. DUBE: May I know whether the Government has any scheme to send more people abroad?

SHRI T. T. KRISHNAMACHARI: We shall have to send many more than we have already.

MR. CHAIRMAN: Questions are over.
