VISIT OF AFGHAN TRADE DELEGATION TO INDIA IN 1957

8. SHRI M. VALIULLA: Will the Minister for COMMERCE AND INDUS TRIES be pleased *to* state whether any Afghan trade delegation is expected to visit India in 1957?

THE MINISTER FOR COMMERCE AND INDUSTRIES (SHRI MOBARJI DESAI) : Government have not so far received any information about such a visit.

PRODUCTION, EXPORT AND IMPORT OF SATIN CLOTH

9. SHRI M. VALIULLA: Will the Minister for COMMERCE AND INDUSTRIES be pleased to state:

(a) the quantity and value of satin cloth—

(i) produced in the country, (ii) exported, and

(iii) imported, in each of the last three years;

and

(b) the reasons for its import?

THE MINISTER FOR COMMERCE AND INDUSTRIES (SHRI MORARJI DESAI): (a) (i) Indigenous production of Satins in 1956 was about 21-1 million yards. Figures for earlier years are not available. Their value is also not readily available as qualities vary considerably.

(ii) and (iii). These figures are also not available as they are not recorded separately in the sea-borne trade account. (b) Only token imports of rayon cloth are permitted to provide an incentive to improvement of indigenous production.

ANTI-INDIAN PROPAGANDA ON KASHMIR Issue in American and British Press

10. SHRI M. VALIULLA: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government are aware that anti-Indian propaganda was carried on in the American and British newspapers in connection with the Kashmir issue; and

(b) if so, what steps Government have taken to counteract such propaganda?

THE PRIME MINISTER AND THE MINISTER FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI JAWAHARLAL NEHRU): (a) Yes.

(b) The Government and its missions abroad took every possible step to explain India's case on Kashmir.
