SHRI JAWAHARLAL NEHRU: I could not quite hear the hon. Member's last part of the question. The hon. Member has referred in his question to foreign help. This involves all kinds of considerations. We suspect there is not one but many organisations in India which indirectly or directly receive foreign help.

SHRI H. C. DASAPPA: May I know, Sir, when this book was first published and how long after its publication the attention of the Government was drawn for the first time to the objectionable passage?

SHRI JAWAHARLAL NEHRU: The time, I imagine, is some months — probably may be more.

SHRI JASWANT SINGH: The hon. Prime Minister has stated that many parties are involved in taking aid from foreign countries. Has it come to the notice of the hon. Prime Minister that the Congress party is included amongst those who receive aid from foreign countries?

MR. DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: Order, order. Next question.

#### PURPOSE AND OUTCOME OF THE VISIT OF THE JAPANESE INDUSTRIAL MISSION

\*151. SHRI H. C. DASAPPA (ON BEHALF OF SHRI M. GOVINDA REDDY): Will the Minister for HEAVY INDUSTRIES be pleased to state the purpose of the recent visit of the Japanese Industrial Mission to India and the outcome of their visit?

THE MINISTER FOR HEAVY INDUSTRIES (SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH): Its purpose was to explore the possibility of developing economic relations between the two countries through technical co-operation and supply of equipment and materials. As a result of their study, the mission will perhaps make some reports to their Government.

SHRI H. C. DASAPPA: May I know, Sir, whether this Mission directed its attention towards any particular heavy industries in India?

SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH: Generally they looked after the machine-building industries. Also, they discussed with several Ministries for the manufacture of machine tools and other equipment and on the trade side for iron ore and other raw materials.

SHRI H. C. DASAPPA: Was there any idea of their collaborating with regard to any particular heavy industries project in India?

SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH: No, Sir. They actually came on a fact finding mission and there was no specific individual purpose for which they came.

SHRI MAHESWAR NAIK: May I know, Sir, whether it is a fact that the Japanese some time back offered to give aid for the development of mining industry in India?

SHRI MANUBHAI SHAH: No, Sir. No such specific proposal was there.
