## GRANT OF SHORT SERVICE COMMISSION TO CIVILIAN TECHNICAL GRADUATES

Tin; DEPUTY MINISTER FOR DEFENCE (SARDAR S. S. MAJITHIA): (a) Technical graduates were not granted Short Service Commissions during 1955, but during that year 45 such graduates were granted Provisional Short Service Regular Commissions for the period of their training. On the successful completion of the' training, 39 of them were granted Permanent Regular Commissions. The training of the remaining six has also been now completed and the results are awaited.

(b) The basis of selection is merit. The relative merit of the candidates JS judged by the Services Selection Board before whom the candidates appear for interview. The candidates selected by the Selection Board have to pass the prescribed medical examination before they can be finally selected.
