(d) what are the main recommendations of the report submitted by the Special Officer?

THE MINISTER FOR COMMUNICATIONS (SHRI JAGJIVAN RAM): (a) Yes.

- (b) The Report of the Special Officer containing the standard evolved was submitted by him in January 1955.
- (c) Government have decided that the standards suggested should be given a trial by the Director-General, Posts and Telegraphs in the first instance and orders to this effect are under issue.
- (d) A statement is appended summing up the recommendations in regard to the Accounts Branch of Head Post Offices and Head Record Offices.

STATEMENT

- 1. Prescription of a uniform procedure for work in the Accounts Branches of Post Offices.

In Andhra two beds in the District Headquarters Hospital, Nellore and one bed in the State Government Hospital, Gudur have been reserved exclusively for mica mining workers. Besides these, the hospitals in different States also cater to the needs of mica workers.

23. SHRI NAWAB SINGH CHA-UHAN: Will the Minister for Pro-DUCTION be pleased to state the progress so far made in regard to the Korba coal project?]

†[THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR PRODUCTION (SHRI SATISH CHANDRA): As a result of the drilling so far done it is possible to plant for opening of three open cast mines and one underground mine. Preliminary work on a pilot quarry has begun and this is expected to go into production in early 1957. Work on the underground mine is also expected to be started very soon and according to

present expectation, the coal will be touched in April 1957. The work on the other two mines will also be taken in hand in a few months' time when the machinery, indented for, starts arriving.

A team of Russian Experts has just arrived in the country. The team will study the project report prepared by an Indian team for the mining of coal in Korba region and generally advise on the mining methods to be adopted for the speedy and ecomic working of the mines and the type of machiney to be used.]
