

Germany for providing technical training and assistance to India; and

(b) if so, what are the details of that agreement?

THE MINISTER FOR EDUCATION (MAULANA ABUL KALAM AZAD): (a) and (b). The Government of West Germany have offered 100 scholarships to Indian students for technical training in Germany and assistance in the establishment of a technological institute in India. Each trainee sent under the Scholarships Scheme will receive 300 German marks per mensem and travelling expenses from and back to India and remission of tuition fees. For the purpose of establishment of the technological institute, the Government of West Germany will provide teaching staff and equipment.

The offers have been accepted and further details are being worked out.

INVESTMENT GUARANTEE INSURANCE SCHEME

*192. **SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA:** Will the Minister for FINANCE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have examined the Investment Guarantee Insurance Scheme as proposed by the United States Government, and

(b) if so, whether any decision has been taken on the same?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR FINANCE (SHRI B R BHAGAT): (a) Yes, Sir. The proposal is still under consideration.

CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE INSTITUTIONS

*198. **SHRI K. SURYANARAYANA:** Will the Minister for HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to refer to para 29 on page 19 of the Report of the Ministry of Home Affairs for 1955-56 and state the lines along which Government propose to develop the Central Forensic Laboratory, the Central Finger-print Bureau and the Central Detective Training School and the locations proposed or fixed, if any for these institutions?

THE MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI B. N. DATAR): Government propose to develop these institutions in such a manner as to facilitate training in scientific investigation of crime, identification of criminals and exhibition of exhibits and finger prints. It is proposed to establish the institutions at Calcutta.

(a) whether information about the availability of Central Government scholarships to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and other Backward Classes was sent to different papers in all the States and if so, during which month; and

(b) how many applications for such Scholarships have been received during this year and how many of them are from girls?

(a) Display advertisement inviting applications for 1956-57 scholarships, appeared in the first and second week of May 1956 in 146 papers.

(b) About 58,000 applications have been received. More are still being received. Their classification separately

UNAUTHORISED STAY AND MOVEMENT OF PAKISTANI NATIONALS IN INDIA

(b) if so, how many; and

(c) whether Government propose to bring forward any new legislation to regulate the entry, stay and movement of Pakistani nationals within India, and if so, what are the main features of the proposed legislation?

THE MINISTER IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI B. N. DATAR): (a) and (b). The information is being collected and will be laid on the Table of the House in due course;

(c) The matter is under consideration.

INDO-PAKISTAN FINANCIAL CONFERENCE

*203. MOULANA M. FARUQI: Will the Minister for FINANCE be pleased to state:

(a) what were the issues discussed at the Indo-Pakistan Financial Conference held in New Delhi in May this year; and

(b) what is the future line of action laid down in the light of these talks in relation to these financial issues?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR FINANCE (SHRI B. R. BHAGAT): (a) The issues mostly related to the disposal of pre-partition claims, settlement of outstandings arising out of the separation of the currencies of the two countries in 1948, the allocation of liability for the return of lease-lend silver to the United States, the basis of the overall financial settlement between the two countries and certain miscellaneous points.

(b) The official talks were only exploratory; the outstanding issues will be discussed at a meeting of the Finance Ministers of the two countries.
