■[ABOLITION OF CENTRAL TRACTOR ORGANISATION

327. SHRI RAM SAHAI: Will the Minister for FOOD AND AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government propose to abolish the Central Tractor Organisation; and

(b) if so, the reasons therefor?

[THE MINISTER FOR FOOD AND AGRICULTURE (SHRI A. P. JAIN): (a) and (b). The Central Tractor Organisation is at present sanctioned up to the end of May 1958. The Government of India are investigating the extent and type of work which the State Governments would like to entrust to the C.T.O. beyond that date, with a view to deciding its future thereafter.]

HOLDING OF CONTRACTS OF BOOKSTALLS AT RAILWAY STATIONS BY A. H. WHEELER & Co.

328. SHRI DEOKINANDAN NARAYAN: Will the Minister for RAILWAYS be pleased to refer to the reply given to my Starred Question No. 258 in the Rajya Sabha on the 14th August 1956 and state:

(a) the reasons why out of 349 book-stalls on railway stations 231 are licensed to A. H. Wheeler & Co.; and

(b) how long they are being conducted by the said company?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR RAILWAYS AND TRANSPORT (SHRI O. V. ALAGESAN): (a) The policy is to give such contracts to well-known firms in the book-selling business, so that a good stock of books and periodicals may always be available at the bookstalls.

M/s. A. H. Wheeler & Co. are a well-known firm in the book-selling business, with a large organization and experience, and their licences on the various Railways have been renewed from time to time in view of their satisfactory performance.

PENSARIES AND MEDICAL STORES

329. SHRI RAM SAHAI: Will the Minister for HEALTH be pleased to state:

(a) whether there is any scheme under consideration by Government to ensure that only persons trained in pharmaceuticals do dispensing work in private dispensaries and medical stores; and

(b) if so, what are the details of the scheme?

English translation.

स्वास्थ्य मंत्री (राजकुमारी अमृत कौर) :

(क) फार्मसी ऐक्ट १९४८ के सेक्शन ४२ के अनुसार राज्य सरकारों को अधिकार है कि वे किसी निश्चित तारीख के बाद रजिस्टर्ड फार्मसिस्ट या उसकी निजी देख-रेख में काम करने वाले व्यक्ति के सिवाय दूसरे आदमी को मेडिकल प्रेक्टिशनर के नुस्खे पर औषधि तैयार न करने दें।

(ख) रजिस्टर्ड फार्मसिस्टों की काफी संख्या हो जाने पर और उनकी ट्रेनिंग की व्यवस्था हो जाने के बाद फार्मसी ऐक्ट के इस सेक्शन के श्रावधानों को लागू करने के लिये राज्य सरकारें आवश्यक कदम उठायेंगी।

THE MINISTER FOR HEALTH: (RAJKUMARI AMRIT KAUR): (a) According to section 42 of the Pharmacy Act, 1948. State Governments have power to ensure that after a fixed date no person other than a registered pharmacist shall compound, prepare, mix or dispense any medicine on the prescription of a medical practitioner except under the direct and personal supervision of a registered pharmacist.

(b) Necessary action to enforce the provisions of this section of the Pharmacy Act will be taken by State Governments when an adequate number of registered pharmacists are available and when arrangements are available for training them.]

EXPORT OF SUGAR

330. DR. RAGHUBIR SINH: Will the Minister (or FOOD AND AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:

(a) whether there is any proposal to export Indian sugar in the near future;

(b) if so, how much sugar is going to be exported, to what countries and on what terms; and

(c) whether the sugar to be exported is in surplus to the local requirements?

REPORT OF THE NETAJI ENQUIRY COMMITTEE (1956)

THE PRIME MINISTER AND MINISTER FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI JAWAHARLAL NEHRU): Sir, I beg to lay on the Table a copy of the Report of the Netaji Enquiry Committee (1956). Placed in Library. See No. S-378/56.J

This Committee was appointed some time ago and it consisted of three members, these three members went to various places and more especially to Japan and took the evidence of a large number of persons, in fact practically of every person who could give any relevant evidence. Thereafter, they came back. I might say that in the course of their stay in Japan, the Japanese Government was enough to give every co-operation and assistance. In the enquiry could hardly have proceeded satisfactorily without that co-operation. I should like to express my deep gratitude to the Japanese Government for the help they gave.

On their return, they came to Delhi for the purpose of writing the report. All the three members came and they jotted down, to begin with, certain points of agreement. I am mentioning this because of subsequent developments. The three members agreed to certain basic points. After that, the work of writing the report was undertaken. When this work was proceeding, one of the members Shri Suresh Chandra Bose, went away from Delhi to Calcutta ; and ever since then, if I may say so, he has been out of reach so far as the Committee is concerned.
