Most of the figures are based on the preliminary reports from the States and the details of the schemes are yet to be scrutinised. The scope of works in a number of States is likely to be altered when the detailed schemes are prepared.

EXTERNAL PUBLICITY

351. Shr. M. VALIULLA: Will the Prime Minister be pleased to state the new proposals, if any, put into effect so far in 1956-57 to improve the arrangement for external publicity in foreign countries?

PRIME **MINISTER** AND MINISTER FOR **EXTERNAL** AF-FAIRS (SHRI JAWAHARLAL NEHRU): The needs of India's external publicity abroad are kept constantly under review For specific activities undertaken improvements made in this direction, the Hon'ble Member is referred to the periodical Administration Reports of the Minister of Efflternal Affairs, which contain a chapter on external publicity as well.

Important new proposals which have so far been implemented during the year 1956-57, are as follows:—

- (1) Three new publicity posts have been sanctioned for Belgrade. Damascus and Jedda. The staff at Jedda has been posted and the offices in Belgrade and Damascus are expected to start functioning very shortly.
- (2) The existing publicity establishments at Djakarta, Kathmandu, Cairo, New York and Washingron have been strengthened.
- (3) A mobile Cinema Van has been provided to our office at Accra. Similar vans are being provided to offices in Bangkok, Colombo, Dacca. Diakarta, Karachi, Lahore, Nairobi, Sikkim and Suva.
