RECOMMENDATIONS OF INTERNATIONAL SOCIETY OF SUGARCANE TECHNOLOGISTS

- 62. MOULANA M. FARUQI: Will the Minister for FOOD AND AGRICULTURE be pleased to state:
- (a) the main recommendations made by the International Society of Sugarcane Technologists at its Ninth Congress held in January-February 1956, for improving the quality and production of sugarcane and sugar; and
- (b) whether any action has since been taken by Government in pursuance of those recommendations: if so what?

MINISTER FOR FOOD AGRICULTURE (SHRI A. P. JAIN): (a) The International Society of Sugarcane Technologists does make recommendations for improving the sugar industry in any particular At the Congresses of the country. Society which are generally held every three years, scientific papers prepared researches and members on developments made in countries are discussed. Symposia are also held on more important problems facing the industry as a whole. these Congresses a number of resolutions are also adopted recommending further subjects for study and considered necessary measures for bringing out improvements in the industry.

The resolutions adopted at the Ninth Congress of the Society held in India in January-February, 1956, related among other things, to world collection of sugarcane varities, germ plasm and breeding, listing of sugarcane diseases of the world, and achieving uniformity in reporting factory data.

- (b) (i) The Government have already taken action for expanding the collection of sugarcane varieties maintained at the Sugarcane Breeding Institute, Coimbatore. The Society has recognised this collection as one of the two outstanding world cane collections, the other being at Canal Point, Florida, U. S. A., maintained by the U. S. Deptt. of Agriculture.
- (ii) A uniform system of chemical control and reporting of data for adoption by Indian factories is being prepared on the basis of the system approved at the 9th Congress of the Society.
- (iii) Experts from India are collaborating with experts from other countries for compiling Technical Monographs on important Sugarcane Diseases and Pests of the world.
