

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: This relates to the various schemes which the Education Ministry has been operating in consultation with the State Governments. The grants are given on a matching basis. It is quite possible that, for certain specific schemes, the State Governments may not have been able to find matching funds and therefore, grants could not be given to them.

DR. RAGHUBIR SINH: Do not the Centrally administered areas send all the details to the Central Ministries here?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: The Government may have records with regard to Government schools, but since the

hon. Member has asked the total number of all schools we will have to collect the information from Community Project areas, from private institutions, etc. If the hon. Member is interested, I have figures here for some of the States, but there is some information still to be obtained from other States.

SHRI MAHESWAR NAIK: May I know what are the steps that the Government are taking for popularising night schools?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: This is primarily the responsibility of State Governments. But we have certain schemes for the development of social education.

SHRI MAHESWAR NAIK: Is any aid given by the Centre to the State Governments for this?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: No, Sir. Not for night schools.

DEVANAGARI SCRIPT REFORM CONFERENCE

*185. SHRI B. M. GUPTE: Will the Minister for EDUCATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether Government have accepted the recommendations of the Devanagari Script Reform Conference held at Lucknow in November, 1953 under the Chairmanship of Dr. S. Radhakrishnan; and

(b) if so, what is the reason for not giving effect to this decision in their later publications e.g., Scientific Terminology Series Booklet No. 185?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR EDUCATION (DR. K. L. SHRIMALI): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) Publication can be brought out in the reformed script only when printing presses are suitably equipped* for the purpose.

SHRI B. M. GUPTE: Has the Ministry informed other Ministries of the decision of the Government and asked them to implement it?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: Yes; all the Ministries and all the State Governments have been informed.

SHRI B. M. GUPTE: What steps are the Ministries taking?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: We have made a reference to the Ministry of Works, Housing and Supply, and requested them to bring the reformed script to the notice of the Controller of Printing and Stationery and other printing presses. They have referred the matter to the Controller of Printing and Stationery who has informed us that the matter is under their active consideration. They have also invited comments from Messrs. Linotype & Machinery Ltd., and Messrs. Eastern Monotype Corporation Ltd., Calcutta. The Government are making every effort to expedite the matter.

DR. RAGHUBIR SINH: May I know, if this reformed script is going to be used in relation to the Sanskrit publications also?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: For all Devanagari publications.

DR. RAGHUBIR SINH: Have the Marathi linguists accepted it?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: I am at present referring to Devanagari script, and this is the decision taken with regard to Devanagari script. I do not know what the Marathi people have accepted.
