(b) whether any money is permitted to be remitted to Goa now; and if so, how much at a time?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR FINANCE (SHRI B. R. BHAGAT): (a) Rs. 51-JI lakhs.

(b) Remittance of funds of Indian origin, is not permitted. Transfer of funds emanating from abroad, is however allowed.

SHRIMATI VIOLET ALVA: Abroad—from where?

SHRI B. R. BHAGAT: From outside India.

SHRIMATI VIOLET ALVA: May I know if Indian currency is still prevailing in Goa?

SHRI B. R. BHAGAT: I am not aware of that.

SHRIMATI VIOLET ALVA: May I know how much a person can carry when he goes from India to Goa?

SHRI B. R. BHAGAT: That is not permitted. That permission has been withdrawn.

SHRIMATI VIOLET ALVA: Does a person, who is permitted to go to Goa, go without any money?

SHRI B. R. BHAGAT: If he is not allowed any money, he may not go.

EXCHANGE OF TEACHERS AND STUDENTS WITH OTHER COUNTRIES

*258. SHRI MAHESWAR NAIK: Will the Minister for EDUCATION be pleased to state:

(a) how many persons from India have so far availed of the benefits of the Scheme of Exchange of Teachers, Professors and Students between India and other countries;

(b) what are the countries which have extended these facilities to India; and

(c) how many foreign students and from what countries have by way of reciprocity been accommodated in India?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR EDUCATION (DR. MONO MOHAN DAS):

(a) Fiftyone persons during 1955-56.

(b) (i) United States of America,
(ii) China.

(c) Ten students from China have come to India during 1955-56 in reciprocity.

SHRI MAHESWAR NAIK: What are the different institutions to which these foreign students are attached?

DR. MONO MOHAN DAS: Under the programme, 10 Chinese scholars came to India in August 1955. One of these scholars who was studying English in Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi, fell ill and went back to China. Of the remaining nine scholars, four are studying English and one person is studying in Jamia Millia Islamia, two are studying Hindi in Allahabad University and the remaining two are studying Urdu in the Aligarh University.

DR. R. P. DUBE: How many have gone to China from India?

DR. MONO MOHAN DAS: Only three up to date.

DR. R. P. DUBE: May I know whether the others of the seven were selected?

DR. MONO MOHAN DAS: About the other four, certain considerations

and discussions with the Chinese Government are taking place.

SHRI MAHESWAR NAIK: What proportion of the cost of training of these students is borne by the Indian Government and the respective Governments?

DR. MONO MOHAN DAS: So far as the student professors who are coming to this country from U.S.A. are concerned, the full expense is borne by the American Government. So far as students coming to this country from China are concerned, we give the actual tuition fees, actual lodging charges, medical expenses, study tours and holiday and youth welfare camp fees.

DR. R. P. DUBE: Is there any chance of these four students going to China at all?

DR. MONO MOHAN DAS: Discussions are taking place between the Chinese Government and our Government.

PROF. G. RANGA: What subjects are chosen for study in China? Is it settled by our students or by the Government?

DR. MONO MOHAN DAS: Our students are going to China to study the Chinese language.

श्रीमती सावित्री निगम : श्रीमन्, भारत में इन विद्यार्थियों पर भारत सरकार को कितना खर्च करना पड़ता है ?

DR. MONO MOHAN DAS: I have said the expenses that are incurred by the Government of India for the Chinese scholars. Some expenditure is to be incurred by the Government of India for our students who go to China. These are the following. Maintenance allowance Rs. 200 per month per scholar, actual cost of books purchased by the scholar on the recommendation of the professor-in-charge, clothing allowance of

Rs. 500 per scholar, and passage expenses both ways.

श्रीमती सावित्री निगम : यह सब कुल मिलाकर कितना बन होता है ?

DR. MONO MOHAN DAS: I am sorry that the figure is not at present available.

SHRI MAHESWAR NAIK: May I know whether this scheme is confined only to student-professors or is it extended to non-students also?

DR. MONO MOHAN DAS: No. This scheme is confined only to students, teachers, professors, research scholars etc.
