

SHRI GULZARILAL NANDA: I may explain that in working out our calculations for the Second Five Year Plan, we take the figures of employment achieved at the end of the First Five Year Plan. This has two aspects, continuing employment and employment in activities like construction, but similar construction programmes are continuing in the Second Five Year Plan. Therefore, the additional employment indicated in the Second Five Year Plan is at a higher level, because of a higher level of construction activity. They may not be the same projects. There are other projects which absorb a larger number.

SHRI MAHESWAR NAIK: Has the Government any idea whatever as to the extent of reduction in unemployment at the end of the Second Five Year Plan?

MR. CHAIRMAN: It is indicated in the Plan itself.

SHRI DEOKINANDAN NARAYAN: In the First Five Year Plan something like two million are shown as engaged in construction, and when that construction work is over, what would happen to these two million?

MR. CHAIRMAN: Other projects will be undertaken and they will be re-employed.

FILMS PRODUCED EXCLUSIVELY FOR CHILDREN

*363. SHRIMATI SAVITRY DEVI NIGAM: Will the Minister for INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

(a) the number of films produced exclusively for children during the year 1955-56; and

(b) the number of films produced under the direct control of—

- (i) the Government of India;
- (ii) Government contractors; and
- (iii) private companies?

THE PARLIAMENTARY SECRETARY TO THE MINISTER FOR INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (SHRI G. RAJAGOPALAN): (a) and (b). In the case of private productions, there is no system of classification of films into those exclusively intended for children, and no statistics are, therefore, available in this regard.

The Films Division of the Government of India produced one children's film magazine in 1955-56. The Children's Film Society have adapted two films and undertaken the production of one full-length feature film.

SHRIMATI SAVITRY DEVI NIGAM: Is there any scheme on hand to get a few other films made by the Ministry?

SHRI G. RAJAGOPALAN: The Children's Film Society was established in May 1955, and they are given the task of producing films for children.

SHRIMATI SAVITRY DEVI NIGAM: Is the Government going to give them any financial aid?

SHRI G. RAJAGOPALAN: Yes, Sir.

SHRI ABHIMANYU RATH: How many children have been included there?

MR. CHAIRMAN: How many children are included in the Board?
