sons trained by the 31st December 1955 is 24,000. Another 8,600 are receiving training. Twenty-five schemes of cottage industries and production centres have also been sanctioned during this year which will provide employment to about 3,500 displaced persons. This is exactly what Mr. Sekhar and Mr. Kishen Chand wanted.

SHRI B. C. GHOSE: In that report also it is said that 178,000 families are yet to be rehabilitated. To what period does it relate?

SHRI MEHR CHAND KHANNA: I am only stating what has been done, and I shall also tell you what remains to be done.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: The figures do not seem to tally.

THE VICE-CHAIRMAN (DR. P. SUBBARAYAN): The debate stands adjourned to the next non-official day.
