the country's current estimated demand is about 10,000' tons per annum. It is not possible to say at this stage when the country would be self-sufficient as this would depend upon the availability of adequate quantity of lead deposits which have yet to be fully explored.

KHADI AND VILLAGE INDUSTRIES EXHIBITIONS IN RURAL AREAS

178. SHRI M. VALIULLA: Will the Minister for Production be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government India have sanctioned any amount to All India Khadi and Village Industries Board for holding exhibi tions in the rural areas;
- (b) if so, whether the Board has drawn up any scheme to hold such exhibitions; and
- (c) if the answer to part (b) above be in the affirmative, the details of the scheme?

THE MINISTER FOR PLANNING (SHRI K. C. REDDY): (a) Yes, Sir. Rs. 300,000 has been sanctioned to the Board for holding exhibitions in the rural areas during 1955-56. In 1954-55 and 1953-54, also, some funds for the purpose were given to the Board.

- These exhibitions Yes. organised either by the State Boards or recognised local Institutions which engaged constructive are in work. All India Khadi and Village Industry Board gives them assistance "by way of grants out of the funds placed at its disposal by the Central Government.
- (c) Exhibitions are usually organised by the Board either on special occasions such as Gandhi Javanti. National Week, Constructive Workers' Conference or are held during fairs or local festive occasions. In these exhibitions, the processes of production of Khadi and village industries are also demonstrated. Sales are also •conducted.
