(b) Reputed firms have been invited to tender for the D. D. T. plant by the 1st October, 1955. The United Nations Technical Assistance Administration have been requested to make available the services of a Design-cwm-Consult-ing Engineer for a period of one year.

SIGNING OF AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES IN HINDI

165. SHRI M. VALIULLA: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state whether it is a fact that Government have decided that all agreements between India and foreign countries should in future be signed in Hindi?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI ANIL K. CHANDA): Government took a decision sometime ago that, as far as possible,

one of the official versions of a treaty should be in Hindi. This practice has been followed in several cases already. Sometimes it has not been possible to follow it, more especially in foreign countries, because of certain practical difficulties. But these difficulties are likely to be less in future. Normally, a treaty has three separate official versions—one in Hindi, a second in the language of the other country, and a third in the English language. All areconsidered equally valid.
