

t [INDIAN INDUSTRIES FAIR TO BE HELD IN DELHI IN 1955

157. SHRI NAWAB SINGH CHAU-HAN: Will the Minister for COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY be pleased to state:

(a) the extent of Government's responsibility in organising the Indian Industries Fair which is going to be held in Delhi in October this year under the auspices of the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry;

(b) the extent of financial and other help which Government propose to give for the purpose; and

(c) what will be the chief features of the Fair?]

वाणिज्य और उद्योग मंत्री (श्री टी० टी० कृष्णामाचारी): (क) और (ख). अक्टूबर १९५५ में जो भारतीय उद्योग मेला होगा उसकी सरकार ने कोई भी सीधी जिम्मेदारी नहीं ली है। फिर भी भारत सरकार ने नई इमारतें बनाने, मौजूदा इमारतों को ठीक करने और प्रदर्शन-स्थल के सामान्य विकास के लिए १६,४८,००० रु० देने स्वीकार किये हैं। मौजूदा तथा नई इमारतें प्रदर्शन को मेल के दिनों में उपलब्ध रहेंगी। इसके अलावा सरकार ने प्रदर्शन के लिए वस्तुओं का निःशुल्क आयात किए जाने की भी अनुमति दी है।

(ग) इस मेल की मुख्य विशेषता यह है कि इसमें व्यापक आधार पर संसार के अन्य देश भाग ले सकेंगे। प्रायः २० देशों ने अब तक इसमें भाग लेने का निश्चय कर लिया है। मेल में पूंजीगत वस्तुओं और मशीनों के प्रदर्शन पर जोर दिया जाएगा।

THE MINISTER FOR COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY (SHRI T. T. KRISH-NAMACHARI) : (a) and (b). No direct responsibility has been undertaken by Government in connection with the Indian Industries Fair which is to be held in October, 1955. The Govern-

(ment of India have, however, sanctioned Rs. 16,48,000 for construction of new buildings, renovation of existing ones and for the development of the exhibition site generally. The existing buildings and the new ones will be made available to the Federation for use during the exhibition. Besides this, Government have also permitted duty-free import of exhibits for purpose of display.

(c) The main feature of the exhibition is that it provides for international participation on a comprehensive scale. About 20 foreign countries have so far decided to participate in this exhibition. The emphasis in the exhibition will be on display of capital goods and machinery.]

SUBSIDIZED INDUSTRIAL HOUSING SCHEME

158. SHRI M. VALIULLA: Will the Minister for WORKS, HOUSING AND SUPPLY be pleased to state:

(a) the amount sanctioned by Government so far to the various State Governments and the private concerns for the construction of tenements under the Subsidized Industrial Housing Scheme, from the beginning of the current financial year (answer may kindly be given Statewise); and

(b) the names of the private concerns to whom the amounts were sanctioned during the above period and the amount given to each private concern?

THE MINISTER FOR WORKS, HOUSING AND SUPPLY (SARDAR SWA-RAN SINGH) : (a) and (b). Two statements giving the required information are placed on the Table of the Sabha. [See Appendix X, Annexure No. 55.]

CABLES PRODUCED BY THE HINDUSTAN CABLES LTD.

159. MOULANA M. FARUQI: Will the Minister for PRODUCTION be pleased to state:

(a) the length of the cables produced by the Hindustan Cables Limited,

from December, 1954 till the end of July, 1955; and

(b) whether the production is in conformity with the target fixed for the period?

THE MINISTER FOR PRODUCTION (SHRI K. C. REDDY): (a) 207 miles.

(b) Yes.

RESEARCH CENTRE FOR ANTI-BIOTICS

160. MOULANA M. FARUQI: Will the Minister for PRODUCTION be pleased to state;

(a)- the estimated cost of construction and equipment of the proposed Research Centre for Anti-biotics; and

(b) by what time the Centre will be in a position to accept trainees from other countries?

THE MINISTER FOR PRODUCTION (SHRI K. C. REDDY) : (a) Total cost of construction and equipment of the proposed Research Centre will be Rs. 15,40,324. The building and fittings will cost Rs. 9,67,324, the equipment Rs. 4,37,000 and the Technical Library Rs. 1,36,000.

(b) The centre will be in a position to accept trainees from other countries by the end of this year or beginning of 1956.

TRAINING PROVISION IN THE D.D.T. FACTORY, DELHI

161. MOULANA M. FARUQI: Will the Minister for PRODUCTION be pleased to state when the D.D.T. Factory at Delhi is expected to provide for the training of technical personnel in the operation and maintenance of delicate chemical equipment and machinery?

THE MINISTER FOR PRODUCTION (SHRI K. C. REDDY): Under the practical Training Stipends Scheme, 1955-56, the D.D.T. Factory, Delhi, has offered to provide facilities for training in plant operations to 2 Graduates in Chemical Engineering, 1 Diploma Holder in Chemical Engineering and 1

Diploma Holder in Mechanical Engineering. The duration of the training will be one year and it is expected to commence shortly.

The above is in addition to the training given by the factory to its own staff and to other technical personnel with a view to absorption either in the same factory or in the proposed D.D.T. factory near Alwaye.

PRODUCTION OF INSECTICIDES IN D.D.T. FACTORY, DELHI

162. MOULANA M. FARUQI: Will the Minister for PRODUCTION be pleased to state:

(a) whether there is a proposal to produce insecticides other than D.D.T. in the D.D.T. Factory at Delhi managed by the Hindustan Insecticides Limited;

(b) if so. what are these insecticides; and

(c) what progress has been made in that direction so far?

THE MINISTER FOR PRODUCTION (SHRI K. C. REDDY) : (a) There is no proposal at present to produce insecticides other than D.D.T. In the Factory at Delhi.

(b) and (c). Do not arise. ' SECOND

D.D.T. FACTORY

163. MOULANA M. FARUQI: Will the Minister for PRODUCTION be pleased to refer to paragraph 7 at page 17 of the Report of his Ministry for 1954-55 and state:

(a) where the second D.D.T. Factory is proposed to be established; and

(b) what progress has so far been made towards its establishment?

THE MINISTER FOR PRODUCTION (SHRI K. C. REDDY): (a) The Factory will be located near Alwaye to Travancore-Cochin.
