Trikamji Dave, Minister for Health, Government of Saurashtra, to go into the question.

SHRI M. GOVINDA REDDY: May I know whether there are any regulations in any of the States with regard to any proficiency or standards of practice for these categories of doctors?

RAJKUMARI AMRIT KAUR: Different States have different standards and therefore it was thought that we should have a uniform policy and that is why this Committee was appointed.

SHRI M. GOVINDA REDDY: May I know the personnel of this Committee?

RAJKUMARI AMRIT KAUR: Chairman is the Health Minister of Saurashtra. The other Members are: the Health Minister of Bombay, the Health Minister of West Bengal, the Health Minister of Hyderabad, the Health Minister of Travancore-Cochin and Dr. H. B. N. Swift, a former Director of Health Services, Punjab who is the Secretary.

SHRI M. GOVINDA REDDY: Do not the Government think it advisable to include representatives of Vaids and Hakims in this Committee?

RAJKUMARI AMRIT KAUR: This is a Committee formed purely by the Council of Health which consists of only Ministers. It is up to the Ministers to call any Vaid or Hakim that they want for evidence.

Dr. W. S. BARLINGAY: When is this Committee expected to report?

RAJKUMARI AMRIT KAUR: It was originally asked to submit its report within six months and then they considered that this time was insufficient and have asked for time to report within a year but they are probably going to submit a progress report by the middle of December so that this may be considered at the next meeting of the Council of Health Ministers.

SHRI KANHAIYALAL D. VAIDYA: May I know whether all the Ministers are qualified in the medical profession? (No reply.)

## EXPLORATORY TUBEWELLS

\*306. MOULANA M. FARUQI: Will the Minister for Food and Agricul-TURE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether field investigations for the selection of sites for sinking 350 exploratory tubewells under the Indo-American Operational Agreement No. 12, have since been completed; and
- (b) if so, the progress so far made in the implementation of the project?

THE MINISTER FOR AGRICULTURE (DR. P. S. DESHMUKH): (a) Yes, except in one or two areas where the investigations will be completed by the Geological Survey of India during the coming winter.

(b) Boring operations under the Project have already started in the Narbada Basin situated in Madhya Pradesh and Bhopal and 21 borings have been done so far.

DR. P. S. DESHMUKH: In the first phase which will extend upto the end of June 1956, we propose to take Madhya Pradesh, Bombay, Saurashtra, Cutch, Travancore-Cochin, Madras and Andhra.

डा० पी० एस० देशमूख: जी नहीं, यह डिपा-र्टमेंटल तार से हो रहा है।

PROF. G. RANGA: When do the Government consider that their investigation or trials have been successfulwhether they fix any minimum quantity of water to be drawn within any specified time-limit in order to be able to say to themselves that it is successful?

DR. P. S. DESHMUKH: We have definite criteria to judge the success of the well. We have extensive experience in this and I think the minimum quantity of water at the required level should be at least 20,000 to 25,000 gallons.

PROF. G. RANGA: What is the economics of it? Do they propose to maintain them at their own cost or at the cost of the State Governments or do they propose to hand them over to Co-operative Societies in the neighbourhood so that the peasants all round can make use of them?

Dr. P. S. DESHMUKH: I would like to have notice of this. I have not got the information.

Dr. W. S. BARLINGAY: Is it a fact that there are only certain particular regions in Madhya Pradesh where tube-wells can be successfully dug?

Dr. P. S. DESHMUKH: Yes, we have definite locations viz., Narbada valley and Purna valley where alone there are possibilities of getting water.

श्री कन्हें यालाल दाँ० वेंद्य : क्या सरकार के ध्यान में यह बात नहीं है कि मध्य भारत कै ट्राइबल एरिया में लाखों व्यक्ति पानी के अभाव में बड़ी दिक्कत उठाते हैं?

डा० पी० एस० दंशमूख: पानी के अभाव का होना और ट्यूब वेल का होना, मेरी समभ में इसका कोई खास सम्बन्ध नहीं हैं।

SHRI T. V. KAMALASWAMY: What is the approximate cost of each tubewell?

DR. P. S. DESHMUKH: The cost is likely to be about Rs. 75,000.

FALL IN RAILWAY EARNINGS DUE TO Concession to Pilgrims

\*307. Moulana M. FARUQI: the Minister for RAILWAYS be pleased to state the extent of deficit suffered by Government in 1954-55 on account of the concessions granted to pilgrims on the Pilgrim Special Trains for 1500 miles or over?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR RAIL-WAYS AND TRANSPORT (SHRI O. V. Alagesan): Concessions in connection with pilgrim special trains are allowed with a view to stimulating rail travel and it would not be correct to assume that Government have suffered any deficit on account of these concessions.
