PRODUCTION OF HONEY

*366 SHRI D. NARAYAN: Will the Minister for PRODUCTION be pleased to state:

(a) how much honey is produced annually in India; and

(b) how Indian honey compares in price and quality with the imported honey?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR PRODUCTION (SHRI SATISH CHANDRA): (a) and (b). Information is being collected and will be laid on the Table of the House in due course.

SHRI D. NARAYAN: May I know. Sir, what steps are being taken to stop adulteration of honey? I understand that some steps are being taken in other countries in this direction.

SHRI SATISH CHANDRA: Sir, the production of honey is being encouraged by the Khadi Board. It has made some start by opening centres for training, encouraging co-operative societies, etc. I do not think we have devoted our attention so far to the problem of adulteration of honey.

SHRI BASAPPA SHETTY: May I know the quantity of honey that is imported from outside, Sir?

SHRI SATISH CHANDRA: The hon. Member should refer that question to the Commerce Ministry.

ENVIRONMENTAL SANITATION IN COMMUNITY PROJECT AREAS

†*318. DR. W. S. BARLINGAY: Will the Minister for PLANNING be pleased to state:

(a) the amount of money which was allocated under the first Five Year Plan for schemes of environmental hygiene and sanitation in the Community Project areas; and

(b) how much of this amount has so far been spent?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR IRRIGATION AND POWER (SHRI J. S. L. HATHI) (a) and (b). Environmental Hygiene and Sanitation forms a part of the programme under the head "Health and Rural Sanitation" indicated in the schematic budget, for which the expenditure ceilings, excluding cost of staff, are as under—

1. Community Projects Blocks 1952-53 series Rs. 6.93 lakhs per project
2. Community Development Blocks 1953-54 series. Rs. 1.05 lakhs per block

The total expenditure incurred on the programme under the head "Health and Rural Sanitation" from its inception up to the end of March 1955 was Rs. 159 lakhs approximately.

DR. W. S. BARLINGAY: That means that a lot of money has not yet been spent. Is that not so, Sir?

SHRI J. S. L. HATHI: In a way it is true. But this is for three years.

DR. W. S. BARLINGAY: But now it is only about six months to go.

SHRI J. S. L. HATHI: The blocks that are taken up in 1953-54 will go up to 1954-55 and 1955-56, and the blocks that will be taken up in 1955, will go up to 1958.
