DR. RAGHUBIR SINH: How are the Germans going to advise us how to write our Indian history?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: Sir, it was not a question of Germans advising India. It was a seminar convened mainly to find out to what extent German history is being taught in Indian schools and what can be done to teach Indian history in Germany. Th£t was a sort of mutual examination of history text-books in both the countries.

SHRIMATI VIOLET ALVA: Since this question deals mainly with text-books of Indian history, why do we need the help of any foreigner to write our history or even to advise us about our history books?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: I am afraid the position is not clear to the hon. Member. This seminar was called and an Indian representative was also invited to participate in the seminar with a view to examine Indian history text-books and And out to what extent German history could be included, whether adequate justice was being, done to German history in our textbooks; and similarly to find out whether adequate justice was being done to Indian history in the German text-books.

DR. RAGHUBIR SINH: But how does German history come into a scheme of Indian history?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: Well, our textbooks on history not only deal with India, but with the whole world, and as such we have to deal with all the countries.

SHRI J. V. K. VALLABHARAO: Under whose auspices was this conference held?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: This conference was convened under the auspices of the International School Textbooks Institute, Brunswick, in cooperation with the UNESCO.

SHRI R. U. AGNIBHOJ: Have we got standard history books on India in our universities on the basis of which history textbooks for high schools could be written?

MR. CHAIRMAN: That is a different question.

RURAL HIGHER EDUCATION COMMITTEE

*452. SHRI M. GOVINDA REDDY: Will the Minister for EDUCATION be pleased to state what steps have been or are being taken towards the implementation of the recommendations of the Committee on Rural Higher Education?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR EDU-CATION (Dr. K. L. SHRIMALI): The recommendations of the Rural Higher Education Committee are under consideration of the Government, and steps are being taken for their implementation.

SHRI M. GOVINDA REDDY: May I know. Sir, whether any scheme has been called for from any institution in the country?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: Yes, Sir.

SHRI M. GOVINDA REDDY: From which States or institutions have these schemes been called for?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: They have been selected from all over the country, and we recently held a conference of the heads of these institutions and nearly twelve institutions from all over the country came.

SHRI M. GOVINDA REDDY: Who selected those institutions?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: When the report was submitted, it was sent to the various institutions which were doing work in rural education and they were selected on the recommendation of the Rural Higher Education Committee.

SHRI M. GOVINDA REDDY: Is it a fact that schemes were called for only from those areas which this Committee visited and not from other areas?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: This Committee visited practically all the States. Of course, it was not possible for the Committee to visit all the institutions in the country, but as far as possible, most of the important institutions which are doing rural education work were visited

SHRI M. GOVINDA REDDY: Was Andhra visited by this Committee?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: No. Sir. We wrote to the Andhra State and we did not get any response from that State, as far as I remember.

SHRI N. D. M. PRASADARAO: i When was this report submitted and how long did it remain under the consideration of the Government?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: The report was submitted last January and we have been considering it. We have already called a conference and we propose to set up a National Council of Rural Education. So steps are being taken to implement the report.

PROF. G. RANGA: Is it not a fact, Sir, that in Andhra there is a rural library organisation of forty years standing and a number of adult education centres have been organised there? And what is more, Members of Parliament themselves were not aware of the appointment of this Committee and its activities.

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: We did write to all the State Governments but, so far as I remember, Andhra did not suggest any institution of the kind referred to by the hon. Member.

SHRI H. C. MATHUR: Now that we have set up a Rural University in Rajasthan, may I know whether that Rural University fits in with the scheme of things?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: There is no Rural University. In fact, the President made it very clear in his speech that he was laying the foundation stone of a Rural Institute, not a University.

DR. SHRIMATI SEETA PARMANAND: Is not a Rural University going to be set up in Kolhapur near Bombay?

Dr. K. L. SHRIMALI: Government have no proposal to set up any Rural University; they have proposals only to set up Rural Institutes.

Dr. RAGHUBIR SINH: May I know how much more time the Education Ministry will take, in addition to the nine months that have already been taken, to conceive its own plans?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI; The plans have already been conceived; probably my hon. friend did not know it. The implementation is being proceeded with.

NAVAL ATTACHES IN INDIAN MISSIONS ABROAD

*453. SHRI M. GOVINDA REDDY: Will the Minister for Defence be pleased to state whether there are any Naval Attaches in the Indian Embassies abroad; and if so, in which | Embassies?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR DEFENCE (SARDAR S. S. MAJITHIA): Yes, in U.K.

SHRI M. GOVINDA REDDY: What are the functions of the Naval Attache in U.K.?

SARDAR S. S. MAJITHIA: His functions are to keep in touch with the latest developments in the Navy of that country and to get other information which we might be interested in.

SHRI M. GOVINDA REDDY: Has the Naval Attache in U.K. any responsibility in the matter of making purchases for India?

SARDAR S. S. MAJITHIA: No, Sir.

PROF. G. RANGA: Was there a Naval Attache in our Embassy in U.S.A.? If so, when was that appointment given up?

SARDAR S. S. MAJITHIA: There is no Naval Attache now; our Military Adviser is acting for the Navy also.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: Is there any proposal to appoint any more Naval Attaches in other Embassies?

SARDAR S. S. MAJITHIA: Yes; Moscow is under consideration.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: Is this appointment on a reciprocal basis? Can we appoint Naval Attaches in every place?

SARDAR S. S. MAJITHIA: So far as we are concerned, we appoint our own Naval Attaches as and when we can afford and the same holds good for the other countries. They can appoint their own Attaches as and when they like.
