(क) तथा (ख). केन्द्रीय सचिवालय तथा संलग्न
कार्यालयों में संदर्शबाहक पद्धति को आरम्भ
करने के प्रश्न पर १९५० में विस्तृत रूप से
विचार किया गया था। फिर भी यह अनुभव
किया गया कि इस पद्धति को उस समय तक
आरम्भ नहीं किया जा सकता, जब तक कि
अच्छे शिक्षित वर्ग के व्यक्ति चतुर्थ श्रेणी पदों
के लिये उपलब्ध नहीं होंगे।

introduction of the Messenger Service System
in the Central Secretariat and attached offices
was considered in all its details in 1950. It
was, however, found that this system could
not be introduced until a much better edu-

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cated class of persons was available for the
Class IV posts.]

NATIONAL MUSEUM, NEW DELHI

*21. DR. RAGHUBIR SINH: Will the
Minister for EDUCATION be pleased to state:-

(a) whether it is a fact that the
construction work of the building for the
National Museum has been suspended for the
present;

(b) if so, what are the reasons for the
suspension of this work; and

(c) when the same will be resumed?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR
EDUCATION (DR. K. L. SHRIMALI) : (a) to
(c). 'The' construction was temporarily
suspended in order to discuss certain aspects
of the plan with the Directors' of established
museums in Europe, and has now been
resumed.

DR. RAGHUBIR SINH: Why were not
such consultations made, Sir, before the
scheme was sanctioned?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: The position is this.
We started construction of the National
Museum but then several newspapers thought
that the plan was not modern and that it had
certain defects. The 'Statesman' particularly,
carried on a big campaign. Government took
notice of it and since the Minister was going -
to Europe, we took advantage of consulting
various Directors of National Museums and I
am glad to inform the House that the plan
which was prepared by the Government of
India met with the general approval of the
various Directors.

DR. RAGHUBIR SINH: May I know for
how long this construction work was
suspended?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: That was just for a
short period.
