

DR. R. P. DUBE: Are there no women available for Overseers' course?

RAJKUMARI AMRIT KAUR: I am not aware that there are any women available for this course.

SHRI T. D. PUSTAKE: Will the Central Government be prepared to give aid to those students to whom State Governments are not prepared to give help?

RAJKUMARI AMRIT KAUR: I do not think there is any question of State Governments not being prepared to give aid. It is for the State Government to spare people. Therefore, it really depends on the States producing or employing more of these personnel.

DR. W. S. BARLINGAY: Has the hon. Minister satisfied herself that the number of Engineers that will come out of the Institution will be sufficient for the purpose of the Second Five Year Plan?

RAJKUMARI AMRIT KAUR: We are working to that effect and we are asking the States to see to it that there are sufficient number of personnel to take up this important work.

(b) the names of the countries which are expected to take part in that meeting?

<DR. P. S. DESHMUKH>: (a) Yes. At Poona.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: May I know, Sir, if the poultry productions from these countries are also expected at the regional meeting?

DR. P. S. DESHMUKH: This is a technical meeting. No poultry productions are going to be brought to this meeting.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: According to a scheme, Government have ordered chickens for distribution. Will they be obtained before this Conference is held?

DR. P. S. DESHMUKH: I do **not** think so. It has no relationship with this technical meeting.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: Sir, is it a fact that 15,000 chickens are available for poultry purposes?

DR. P. S. DESHMUKH: That does not arise out of this question.
