PROF. G. RANGA: By the term "whole-time permanent Examiner Boards" are we to understand that these people will be busy only when the examinations are on and whenever examinations are not taking place, they would be expected to do some teaching work?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: I may refer the hon. Member to the Report of the University Education Commission. That body recommended the establishment of permanent wholetime Examiner Boards. We have written to the Universities to tell us to what extent these recommendations have been carried out.

DR. SHRIMATI SEETA PARNANAND: What is the amount sanctioned for this purpose and how many professors have been appointed for this purpose?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: In the statement which has been laid on the Table of the House, we have given the number of scholarships which have been accorded, but I shall need notice with regard to the exact amount spent on the Institute.

*215. SHRI KISHORI RAM: Will the Minister for DEFENCE be pleased to state the number of aerodromes, constructed in Assam during the Second World War, which are in use now?

SHRI S. N. MAZUMDAR: Are there any aerodromes constructed during the war which are now under private management?

SARDAR S. S. MAJITHIA: I am not aware of any.

DR. RAGHUBIR SINH: How many have been abandoned, Sir?

SARDAR S. S. MAJITHIA: There were actually seventeen with pucca runways and twenty with only fair-weather strips.

SHRI BHUPESH GUPTA: May I know if any of these strips are being utilised by certain plantation owners in Assam?

SARDAR S. S. MAJITHIA: I have got no information about that because we have abandoned those that we do not want.

SHRI S. N. MAZUMDAR: May I know whether Government has any information as regards private airstrips and the flights that take off from them?

SARDAR S. S. MAJITHIA: I am afraid we do not take any note of private airstrips used by private aircraft.

SHRI S. N. MAZUMDAR: Is it not reasonable, Sir, to expect that Government should keep a note of the flights that take off from these private airstrips which are situated on the borders, especially with these British planters there?

SARDAR S. S. MAJITHIA: We certainly see that nothing takes place which goes against the interests of India. Beyond that, we are not interested.

HISTORY OF FREEDOM MOVEMENT

*216. DR. RAGHUBIR SINH: Will the Minister for EDUCATION be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is proposed to dissolve the Board of Editors set up to collect materials for writing the History of Freedom Movement at the end of the year 1955;

(b) if so, what are the reasons for this decision; and

(c) how much money has so far been spent on this Board during each year of its existence?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR EDUCATION (DR. K. L. SHRIMALI): (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) When the Board was set up, it was laid down that the work would have to be completed by 31st December, 1955. The material that could possibly be collected will have been collected by that date.

DR. RAGHUBIR SINH: May I know if an order was passed by the Ministry for the winding up of this Board by the end of July, 1955?

DR. RAGHUBIR SINH: What is going to be the fate of the material that has been collected by this Board?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: The material that has been collected is very valuable but Government have not yet considered as to what to do with that material.

DR. RAGHUBIR SINH: Is it not possible that the material be handed over to the Indian National Archives?

DR. K. L. SHRIMALI: Nothing has been decided about that matter.
