- (i) rearing of imported baby chicks at the Indian Veterinary Research Institute, Izatnagar, and State Government Poultry Farms,
- (ii) their distribution in trios (2 females and one male) at special concessional rates in development blocks located mainly in the Community Project Areas and National Extension Service Blocks, and
- (iii) establishing 300 poultry extension centres in the various States for demonstrating scientific methods of breeding, feeding and management of poultry.
 - (c) Rs. 145 lakhs.
