season, namely, from November to January, there is over-crowding and travelling on roofs of trains to some extent on this section.

(b) Yes.

(c) (i) During Novembei and December 1954, special trains were run to clear the passengers left behind.

(ii) Trains Nos. 305 and 306, which were diverted to Domohani from 13th November 1954, are being run through to and from Alipurduar from 10th February 1955.

(iii) Further examination of this problem is being made and whatever action is practicable will be taken.

THE MINISTER FOR COMMUNICA-TIONS (SHRI JAGJIVAN RAM): (a) Post Offices without telegraph branches 10. Combined Post and Telegraph offices 2.

(b) 7 post offices (5 departmental suboffices and 2 extra-departmental branch offices) are due to be opened at the request of the North-East Frontier Agency by the 31st March 1956. Of these, 4 will be combined post and telegraph offices. The question of opening post and telegraph offices in the next two years, 1956-57 and 1957-58, will depend upon the policy to be enunciated for the Second Five Year Plan which is under consideration.
