

Wherever jowar goes below Rs. 5/8, we go and purchase. In the case of rice, we have fixed Rs. 11 as a fair and economic price. The question of purchasing has not arisen because it has not gone down below Rs. 11. We have not purchased any rice so far because that situation has not arisen.

PROF. G. RANGA: Is that the latest position? What kind of rice is my hon. friend thinking of? Is it the first quality or the second quality?

SHRI M. V. KRISHNAPPA: Whenever we fix a minimum price, it is for the coarse grain. It varies with the other varieties.

SHRI H. C. MATHUR: Is it not a fact that the Chief Minister of U.P. definitely stated that, if the prices go down below the rates stated by the hon. Minister, they will not be in a position to purchase the grains, and if it is so, what steps does the Government propose to take to dis-abuse the impression created in the minds of the people by -that statement?

DR. P. S. DESHMUKH: We will do the needful in the matter.

SHRI P. S. RAJAGOPAL NAIDU: May I know why, when the Madras Government has recommended the purchasing of bajra in centres where it has gone down below Rs. 6, the Government of India has not taken any steps to purchase bajra in Cud-dalore and Tuticorin areas?

DR. P. S. DESHMUKH: The actual purchase is done by the State Government. It is for them to follow the trends in the mandies and purchase it whenever it falls below this level. We can only give them the necessary financial assistance.
