*477. SHRI M. VAL1ULLA (ON BEHALF OF MOULANA M. FARUQI): Will the Minister for TRANSPORT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the equipment required lor the Upper Ganga Pilot Project will be manufactured in India or it will be imported from foreign countries; and
- (b) if it is to be imported, the countries from which it will be imported?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR RAILWAYS AND TRANSPORT (SHRI O. V. ALAGESAN): (a) The equipment required for the Upper Ganga Pilot Project will be built in India

(b) Does not arise.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: What is the cost of the equipment that will be built in India?

SHRI O. V. ALAGESAN: About 17-3 lakhs, Sir.

LOCUST INVASIONS

479. SHRI M. VALIULLA (ON BEHALF OF MOULANA M. FARUQI): Will the Minister for FOOD AND AGRTCOT,-TURE be pleased to state the extent o damage caused to crops on account of locust invasions during 1954-55?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR FOOD AND AGRICULTURE (SHRI M. V. KRISHNAPPA): The damage caused to crops is estimated to be about Rs. 50,00,000.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: Has any good result been shown after steps were taken to prevent such invasion and destruction of crops?

SHRI M. V. KRISHNAPPA: Yes, Sir. But for our all-out efforts to put down this locust menace, the loss would have been irt terms of crw*>«

Last year, in the course of one year alone, 176 swarms came into India and we were able to destroy all these except four. Even the four were destroyed some time later. If there was not this all-out effort on our part, the loss would have been much more.

SHRI M. VALIULLA: May I know the expenditure incurred by the Government in that year to destroy these locusts?

SHRI M. V. KRISHNAPPA: The exact expenditure incurred by the Government cannot be given.

PROF. G. RANGA: Is any effort being made by the Union and the State Governments to give relief to the *kisans* who have had to suffer all this loss, either by way of remission of land revenue or any other relief?

SHRI M. V. KRISHNAPPA: Out of this Rs. 50 lakhs spent, three-fourths of this amount was spent in Rajasthan. The Rajasthan Government has declared these villages as scarcity affected areas and some relief work is being given to those parts.

SHRI KANHAIYALAL D. VAIDYA: May I know the States in which these attacks take place?

SHRI M. V. KRISHNAPPA: There are so many vulnerable States. Generally the locusts come from Pakistan, enter into Rajasthan and go to Punjab, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh and Bombay.

PROF. G. RANGA: Delhi?

SHRI M. V. KRISHNAPPA: Delhi is included in Uttar Pradesh.

- (ii) Total number of railway employees—Rs. 950,101.
- (iii) No. of labourers on daily wages out of (ii) above—Rs. 119,500.
