

REPORT OF THE PRESS COMMISSION

MR. DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: Now there are only two minutes. Dr. Keskar.

SEVERAL HON. MEMBERS: No, no. Not at this time.

SHRI H. N. KUNZPU (Uttar Pradesh): There is no point in asking Dr. Keskar to speak now.

SHRI V. K. DHAGE (Hyderabad): I suggest that the hon. Minister, Dr. Keskar, be allowed to move the motion now. And he can continue his speech later on.

MR. DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: You may just move the motion, and you may make your speech on the next occasion.

SHRI B. K. P. SINHA (Bihar): Sir, before he moves the motion, we must know as to when he will be able to make his speech.

MR. DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: Order, order.

THE MINISTER FOR INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING (DR. B. V. KESKAR): Sir, I beg to move:

"That the Report of the Press Commission be taken into consideration."

Sir, in view of the fact that there is only one more minute left now, I would not like to begin a couple of sentences and then stop. So, with your permission, I will speak on the next day, whenever it is taken up.

MR. DEPUTY CHAIRMAN: The date will be fixed subsequently. The House stands adjourned till 11 A.M. on Monday.
