DEMISE OF SHRI SURES CHANDRA  
MAZUMDAR**

**ANNOUNCEMENT REGARDING  
CHANGE OF NAME OF THE COUNCIL  
OF STATES**

MR. CHAIRMAN: With the concurrence of the Prime Minister and the Leader of the Council, I have decided that the Council of States will be called "Rajya Sabha" and its Secretariat. "The Rajya Sabha Secretariat".

DR. RADHA KUMUD MOOKEBBI (Nominated): May I offer a few comments on this, Sir?

As a student of history, I should say that the term "Rajya" is very inappropriate and somewhat inconsistent with the Republican Constitution for which India stands. The term "Rajya" smacks of the King and "Rajya" means kingdom. I should say, properly speaking, that it should be termed "Rashtra" which is really the term for "State" and the Council of States should be aptly called "Rashtra Sabha".
