STATEMENT ON RECENT FLOODS IN EASTERN PARTS OF INDIA

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI B. N. DATAR): Sir, with your permission I beg to make a statement on the recent floods in the Eastern parts of India. It is a matter for deep regret that this year again there have been disastrous floods in the Eastern parts of India. Full details about these floods, particularly regarding the extent of damage caused are not yet available, but on the basis of the reports that I have so far received from the State Governments concerned, the position is as follows:—

The worst affected areas are Assam and Bihar where the flood waters have submerged 12,000 and 10,000 square miles respectively. West Bengal and Uttar Pradesh have also suffered heavy damages.

The cause of floods in Assam is stated to be the silting up of the bed of the Brahmaputra which is the main drainage channel. This caused widespread floods extending from Sadiya to Dhubri. The first flood occurred in the middle of June and the second one
