The level up to which the economic recovery of the individual should have taken place before he can be said to have been completely rehabilitated is not easy to define and so far no such definition has been suggested or worked out. Consequently, it is not possible to estimate expenditure required for complete rehabilitation or to indicate the time by which the work is likely to be completed.
