Dr. K. N. KATJU: As I said* the information of the Government is that the matter is under most active investigation.

SHRI KISHEN CHAND: Is the hon. Minister aware if the funds of the ^JIttehad-ul-Musalmin" are being released and are being utilised for carrying on anti-Indian propaganda?

DR. K. N. KATJU: I do not know.

SHRI KISHEN CHAND: Is the hon. Minister aware that the Nizam of Hyderabad has issued certain statements prejudicial to India in the Urdu local papers?

MR. CHAIRMAN: Don't ask such questions.

PROF. G. RANGA: Do the Govern ment of India propose to.....

DR. K. N. KATJU: The great difficulty which I sometimes feel—I am not saying it in joke—is that when several hon. Members rise, the attention is diverted from one Member to another Member.

PROF. G. RANGA: That is by the way. Do the Government of India propose to appoint an impartial and highly placed judicial authority to enquire into the cause of these things, namely, due to agent provocateurs or various other organisations or anything like that, so that all these various suspicions that are being floated today, all that are being given currency to, can be set at rest?

DR. K. N. KATJU: I may assure my hon. friend that we are already taking and have taken the most active steps for finding out as to what are the real causes and I beg him not to press me too much on this.

Mr. CHAIRMAN: Next question.

SHRI KISHEN CHAND: Is the hon. Minister aware that the Pakistani flag was also found flown in Raipur?

Mr. CHAIRMAN: I have called tha next question.

- •331. SHRI T. S. PATTABIRAMAN: Will the Minister for DEFENCE be pleased to state:
- (a) whether it is a fact that Government advertised in the press of the United Kingdom in May last inviting applications for the filling up of various posts in the Technical Training College at Jalahalli, Bangalore; and
- (b) if so, how many persons applied and how many of them were selected for appointment to those posts?
- THE DEPUTY MINISTEB FOR DEFENCE (SHRI SATISH CHANDRA): (a) Yes, Sir.
- (b) 49 candidates applied out of which 8 were selected for appointment.
- SHRI T. S. PATTABIRAMAN: Is it a fact that the firm Air Service Training Ltd., Hamble estimated originally that they will train all the Indians within five years since 1949?
- SHRI SATISH CHANDRA: A contract was signed about five years ago with Air Service Training Ltd., Hamble that they will train out technicians during this period. They have trained hundreds of our technicians in this country. That contract has expired on 3rd July 1954. The Government of India is now making its own arrangements to run the technical training college by obtaining some help from the company.
- SHRI T. S. PATTABIRAMAN: Islt a fact that the advertisement which was made in England contained an item calling for applications for instructors without any qualifications being prescribed? The advertisement
