FILLING OF POSTS IN TECHNICAL TRAINING College, Jalahalli

*331. SHRI T. S. PATTABIRAMAN: Will the Minister for Defence be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that Government advertised in the press of the United Kingdom in May last inviting applications for the filling up of various posts in the Technical Training College at Jalahalli, Bangalore; and
- (b) if so, how many persons applied and how many of them were selected for appointment to those posts?
