SHRI RAJ BAHADUR: The Khawda and Bella connection was examined but it was either not found to be practicable or remunerative.

SHRI LAVJI LAKHAMSHI: Is it not a fact that constantly this area is the victim of raids and dacoities from Pakistan?

SHRI RAJ BAHADUR: For that purpose there are ample arrangements for communication.

CONVERSION OF KANDLA-BHUJ NARROW GAUGE LINE INTO METRE GAUGE LINE

*505. SHRI LAVJI LAKHAMSHI: Will the Minister for RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) whether the work of converting the narrow gauge railway line between Kandla and Bhuj into metre gauge has commenced; and

(b) if so, how long it will take to complete the work?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR RAILWAYS AND TRANSPORT (SHRI O. V. ALAGESAN): (a) Yes, Sir.
