Reliable information about acreage of crops affected by locusts is not available.

Written Answers

(d) The loss of agricultural produce caused by locusts in India, as estimated by the various States concerned amounted to 20,400 tons in 1950; 14,350 tons in 1951; 19,150 tons in 1952 and 640 tons in 1953. In terms of cash value of losses can roughly be placed at 1.5 crore of rupees for the period 1950—54.
