THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR LABOUR (SHRI ABID ALI): (a) Yes.

(b) This is a matter for the Labour Appellate Tribunal to decide and not for Government.

REPORT OF THE RAILWAY CORRUPTION ENQUIRY COMMITTEE

444. DR. R. P. DUBE: Will the Minister for RAILWAYS be pleased to state the date by which the report of the Railway Corruption Enquiry Committee is expected to be submitted to Government?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR RAILWAYS AND TRANSPORT (SHRI O. V. ALAGESAN): The Committee, it is understood, hopes to complete its work before the next Budget Session, if not earlier.

REMODELLING OF NEW DELHI RAILWAY STATION

445. DR. R. P. DUBE: Will the Minister for RAILWAYS be pleased to state whether the cost of remodelling the New Delhi railway station building is being met from revenue or from capital or from any of the railway reserve funds?
