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CLOSURE OF TEA GARDENS IN ASSAM

20. SHRI M. VALIULLA: Will the Minister for Commerce and Industry be pleased to state:

(a) how many tea gardens in Assam have been closed down during the last two years;

(b) what is the acreage of these gardens; and

(c) the number of persons who were working in these gardens before they were closed down?

THE MINISTER FOR COMMERCE (SHRI D. P. KARMARKAR): (a) Eighty six out of which 77 have since reopened.

(b) 43817.62 acres in the 86 gardens which were closed. The acreage of the 77 gardens since re-opened is 41846.24.

(c) 49,620 in the gardens which were closed. 37,478 people are working in the gardens since reopened.

(a) what will be the recurring expenditure on the Community Projects after their completion; and

(b) what is the estimated percentage of the total area of the country that will be brought under this scheme?

THE DEPUTY MINISTER FOR IRRI-GATION AND POWER (SHRI J. S. L. HATHI): (a) The figure of recurring expenditure on the Community Projects after their completion, has not been precisely worked out so far. A reference is, however, invited to Chapter 15 of the Five Year Plan which says that the expenditure, mostly recurring, is likely to be about Rs. 3 lakhs per project.

(b) The intention, as visualised in the Five Year Plan, is to bring the entire country under extensive development within a period of about 10 years. During the period of the present plan, however, it is proposed to cover approximately 1/4th of the total rural population.
