STATEMENT

Results of the Examination of the Lower Gondwana Rocks of Lish Valley in Darjeeling.

An examination of the three blocks in the Himalavan foot hills situated in the Yangmakum Khasmahal lands and the Chel Reserved Forest area in Darjeeling district was undertaken by the Geological Survey of India in November 1952, with a view to find out whether mining operations in this area would affect the stability of the hill slope. The study revealed,-

> (i) that mining operations could be undertaken without undue danger to the stability of the hill slope;
