363. Shri M. VALIULLA: Will the COMMUNICATIONS Minister for he pleased to state:

THE MINISTER FOR COMMUNICA-TIONS (SHRI JAGJIVAN RAM): (a) Yes, it is the policy of the Government of India to provide an air link for the capital of each State provided there is sufficient air-traffic potential and a suitable site is available in the vicinity for an aerodrome.

(b) Out of the 27 States in India, aerodromes already exist at the capitals of 20, as shown in the statement which I lay on the Table. [See Appendix VII, Annexure No. 200.]

It is proposed to construct an aerodrome at Chandigarh shortly. Preliminary surveys are in hand for selecting a suitable site for the construction of an aerodrome near Shillong also
