INDIAN MILITARY MISSION IN NEPAL

192. SHRI M. VALIULLA: Will the PRIME MINISTER be pleased to state:

(a) whether there is any Indian Military Mission stationed at Kathmandu (Nepal),

(b) if so, what is the strength of this Mission;

(c) who pays for the maintenance of this Mission; and

(d) the circumstances under which the Mission was sent there?

THE PRIME MINISTER AND MINIS-TER FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS AND **DEFENCE** (SHRI JAWAHARLAL NEHRU): (a) Yes.

(b) The strength of the Mission is 197 including officers.

(c) Pay and compensatory allowance are borne by the Government of India, while expenditure on accommodation and transport is borne by the Nepal Government.

(d) The Mission was sent to Nepal in April 1952 at the request of the Government of Nepal for the training and re-organisation of the Nepalese Army.
